ARRUPE VIRTUAL LEARNING INSTITUTE (AVLI formerly JVLA) COURSES

AVLI online courses have additional course fees -

- One-Semester (0.5 credit) course **\$265 + Textbook costs**
- Full-Year (1 credit) course **\$370 + Textbook costs**
- AP courses through AVLI will have an **additional fee for the AP test**.
- Families will be reimbursed 100% for students dropping during the first week of classes, 50% for dropping prior to the end of week two, and no reimbursement thereafter.
- All prices are subject to change.

Any AVLI course may be taken but only Approved Courses may replace a 6th class in a junior or senior schedule.

IMPORTANT - Students who are enrolled in AP courses at U of D Jesuit or through the Arrupe Virtual Learning Institute will be required to take the AP exams in the Spring.

DUAL ENROLLMENT

Dual Enrollment is limited to courses outside of the U of D Jesuit curriculum.

The State of Michigan enacted legislation that permits students in public and private schools to benefit from dual enrollment. Dual Enrollment allows students in grades 9 - 12 to take courses (including on-line) at Michigan public or private colleges or universities. If the student qualifies, tuition, fees, and books are paid for by the State of Michigan. Any portion not covered by the State of Michigan is the responsibility of the student’s family.

Participation in dual enrollment does not exempt a student from earning all the required credits for graduation as specified in the school handbook. Private school students are not given the option by the State of Michigan to take courses for high school credit; only college credit can be awarded. College courses need to be taken after school or during the weekend. Eligible students may elect no more than 10 courses while in high school.

Because of the restrictions and deadlines involved, it is very important that students be in contact with the Academic Affairs office regarding Dual Enrollment. There may be circumstances where a dual enrollment course can be considered a student’s sixth class of the day. For example students who have completed all courses in a subject area such as math or foreign language.
